THE FUTILITY OF LIFE

Thoughts from Dr. David Jeremiah based on the book of Ecclesiastes

Students were asked what was most important to them. They answered first to make a lot of money and second to find meaning in life. Most people today lack meaning and purpose for life. The absence of meaning in life is the reason for substance abuse and extreme behavior.

Solomon was searching for meaning in **Ecclesiastes**. He first wrote **Song of Soloman** then **Proverbs** and ended with Ecclesiastes. Solomon reigned in a time of peace and prosperity. He had money and time to persue wisdom and the meaning of life.

He asked for and received wisdom as he started his reign. Then in life he wandered from his beginnings. As he got older he began looking for truth, meaning and the value of life. In **1:1** he states the conclusion of his search: *all is vanity under the sun*. Where is the profit of life? Without God all is vain under the sun.

He sees no purpose or value to life as lived under the sun. It just goes around and around. Generation after generation. As he looks toward death he searches for what life was all about. Once we die life goes on without us as if we had never existed. *Life without God is futile with no purpose*, *meaning or lasting value*.

Nothing is fulfilling (1:8) for without God there is restlessness of heart. Hence the need for entertainment and distraction we see today. Acts 17:21 speaks to this: people are looking for something new, novelty is the latest greatest thing.

Satisfaction comes only with God for we are hungry and unsatisfied without God. 1:9-11, there is nothing new under the sun, all resources were here in the beginning.

Soloman had lost his closeness with God and as he persued his life without God he found emptyness and lost the meaning of life (6:12). 3:11 is the key to the book, God creates us with a place within us for Himself. We are made for the next world, not for this one. Invite God in and He makes us alive with meaning, purpose, and fulfillment.

Matthew 11:29 tells of God giving rest, meaning, and fulfillment. Without God, life makes no sense, He created us and He fulfills us. Under the sun – futility; with the Son – meaning and purpose.

Go with God literally and continually. It is the only way to live!

SAYING GRACE

A visiting Pastor was attending a men's breakfast in Farm Country. He asked one of the impressive older farmers in attendance to say grace that morning. After all were seated, the older farmer began –

"Lord, I hate buttermilk." The Pastor opened one eye and wondered to himself where this was going. Then the farmer loudly proclaimed, "Lord, I hate lard." Now the Pastor was worried.

However, without missing a beat, the farmer prayed on, "And Lord, you know I don't care much for raw white flour." Just as the Pastor was ready to stand and stop everything, the farmer continued, "But Lord, when you mix 'em all together and bake 'em up, I do love fresh biscuits. So Lord, when things come up we don't like, when life gets hard, when we just don't understand what you are sayin' to us, we just need to relax and wait 'till You are done mixin', and probably it will be somethin' even better than biscuits. Amen."
