HARD LOVE

Luke 6:27-38

We like love, we like to love, we like to be loved. But God and God through His Son Jesus The Christ has a different attitude about love; who to love and how to love. When we first think about love we think of romantic love. Most likely because of Hollywood. But there is much more to love than Hollywood displays. Love, to love, is a verb. Not a feeling. How about a definition of love that goes something like this: *Love is* doing good things for others. Like laying down your life for your friend. Like serving those you would rather avoid. Or, as we find in the Luke 6 passage, loving your enemies. Do you even have enemies? Known enemies? It is rather rare for us to have known enemies. Satan is our enemy, and he uses people to come against us to inhibit our ability to be God's person. Do you know of anyone who is actively working against you? I have experienced this when I was in grade school and it went on into High School for a year to two. It is not a pleasant experience to have someone telling others how bad of a person you are. I even experienced some of this for a time here as your pastor. God took care of both instances for me. We are not responsible for the actions of others. We are responsible for our actions. And our actions are to be based in love. Agape love. Love that serves others and puts them ahead of our self interests. The Luke 6 passage begins with the words, "But I tell you who hear me". How well do we hear God? Lord give us the ears to hear and the eyes to see you in all we do. Jesus goes on, "Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who mistreat you". Then he goes on to describe how to react to being persecuted, such as, turning the other cheek, giving to the one who wants to take from you. Giving to everyone who asks. If someone takes from you do not demand it back. I do not live this out in my life very well, do you? I work hard for what is mine. I have it because I worked for it and want it. Why would I be so willing to let it go to a person who just takes it? I guess God has a different economy than I do. It does not say that God will make it right like he did for Job. It just says that people are more important than things. Loving those who love us is not a credit to us. Lending to those who can pay it back is not either. Love our enemies, do good to them. Lend to them without expecting to get anything back. Then our reward will be great, and we will be sons of the Most High, because he is kind to the ungrateful and wicked. Be merciful, just as our Father in Heaven is merciful. One last comment. Have you ever wondered how it is to lay up for yourself treasures in heaven? The answer is what you just read!!

In Christian Economics, January 7, 1958

Some people do not believe in miracles, but human life is the greatest miracle of all and no one doubts it.

What greater miracle than the thinking power of a few pounds of grayish protoplasm in our skulls that can remember the past, plan for the future, make decisions and carry them out? If you can believe that, and who doubts it, almost any other miracle looks simple.

No wide-angle camera lens can take in nearly 50 per cent of the sphere around us as can the human eye. Some might regard color television as a miracle, but the eye can do it and with instantaneous development.

Regeneration of the soul, changing the apparently hopeless alcoholic, the helpless victim of narcotics, or the fierce criminal into a kind and loving husband, a thoughtful, conscientious parent, a good neighbor and a pillar in the church, is a miracle. The transmutation of hate to love by the grace of God is a miracle. No one who has observed these phenomena can doubt them.

The atom is so small we cannot see it, even with the finest instruments, but locked within it is the power that keeps the sun blazing in the heavens millions upon millions of years. That's a miracle, and no informed person doubts it.

Why stumble or quibble over miracles? They are all around us. How does a baby eel find its way from the central Atlantic up the tiny fresh water creeks and after reaching maturity some years later, go back to the same place in the ocean where it spawns and dies? How does the bird, after wintering in the south, find its way to the Arctic lake where it spends its summer? Or how does the bee find its way through fog or darkness back to the hive?

God's universe is filled with miracles. It does not require faith to believe them but only sufficient intelligence to recognize the facts.
