TIMOTHY

I did some research on Timothy of the Bible recently and I thought I would share with you what I learned from the search. I Googled Timothy, I have never done that before. I found some interesting information by doing that. See, grandparents can learn from grandchildren and modern ways of doing things. Timothy was the son of a Greek father and a Jewish mother. There are two books in the Bible addressed to him. They are letters of encouragement from the Apostle Paul. Timothy joined Paul during one of his later missionary journeys. Paul calls Timothy a true son in the faith. It is guessed that he was about twenty years of age. But Timothy had already distinguished himself as faithful and the elders had noticed him. It is guessed that Timothy had responded to the gospel when Paul came through the area of Derbe and Lystra on his first missionary journey. Timothy served as Paul's representative to several churches and he was later a pastor in Ephesus. Timothy is mentioned as being with Paul when Paul wrote several New Testament letters.

What can we learn from Timothy all these years later? Timothy had genuine faith as did his mother Eunice and grandmother Lois. He had good upbringing to prepare him for the Gospel. Eunice, Lois, and Timothy all accepted the teachings of Paul and committed their lives to the Savior. We can learn from this to prepare our children to receive the message of Christ. There is also teaching on how to live for God through Christ contained in the letters to Timothy. Timothy is encouraged to set an example for other believers in speech, in conduct, in love, in faith, and in purity. Timothy teaches: Be devoted to reading Scripture, exhorting, and teaching, and do not neglect the gift that God has given to you. Be diligent in keeping a close watch on ourselves. We also should pursue righteousness, godliness, faith, love, endurance, and gentleness. We need to be willing to fight the good fight of faith. Take hold of the eternal life to which we were called when we made our good confession in the presence of witnesses. Beware of false teachers and continue in the things we have learned; the truths of sin and our need for a Savior. As parents we are to prepare our children to distinguish truth from error. And as believers we are to stand firm in the truth we have learned, not being surprised or swayed by opposition and false teachers. We too most do our best to present ourselves to God as one approved, a worker who does not need to be ashamed and who correctly handles the word of truth. Scripture is God breathed and good for correcting and training in righteousness, so that us servants of God, may be thoroughly equipped for every good work. All, that we might be faithful and useful to God for the furthering of His Kingdom on Earth as it is in Heaven.
