Teach Us to Pray "Thy Kingdom Come" Fr. James Martin, SJ

How many times have you prayed the **Our Father**? Hundreds, thousands, perhaps tens of thousands of times over your life? Yet many parts of the prayer may still seem mysterious. Take the phrase, "*Thy kingdom come*." Sometimes during a serious illness our personal crisis people tell me that they are trying to pray for **God's will** to be done. Often, I am tempted to say that God's will is going to be done whether or not we pray for it. And I may say that it's noble to pray for that, but it's also okay to pray for what they desire: healing or peace of mind. At the same time, **Jesus** himself prays for God's will to be done in the Garden of Gethsemane. What, then, does mean to pray in the Our Father not only for God's will to be done but for his kingdom to come? The New Testament scholar **Daniel J. Harrington, SJ**, calls that phrase the "*central concern of the entire prayer*." It expresses the desire for a future kingdom, or reign, in all its fullness, in which God's will is realized: "perfect harmony . . . Between the way heaven and earth run." Expressing our desire for that realization may help us to actualize it on earth. In other words, ask: "What can I do to bring God's reign to earth?" You're not God of course, but you still can do your part. Can you be more loving, more forgiving, more generous? Allow God's reign to enter your heart, and you will help to bring it about on the earth.
