WALKING IN THE FAVOR OF GOD – PART TWO

What we see in the story of **Noah** is still applicable to our lives today. *Genesis: 6:8*Noah lived in a wicked time but he "found favor in the eyes of the Lord". This is the kind of affirmation from **God** that we should all desire and pursue in order to honor and please Yahweh, our Living God. The favor of God is His acceptance, approval, provision, divine energy, and joy given to us. To have His favor we must learn to listen to God and to trust in Him. Proverbs 3:5-7 shows us how to walk with God as Noah did. "Trust in the Lord with all your heart and do not lean on your own understanding. In all your ways acknowledge Him, and He will make your paths straight." Noah lived in a time of great wickedness. All was corrupt and God decided to wipe all living creatures from the earth, but Noah was different from everyone else. He was a righteous man, blameless in his time, and he walked with God. He had a relationship with Yahweh the Living God of creation. In this relationship God instructed him to build an ark. And Noah started building. We do not have to understand all that God is doing to be obedient to His instruction. Our human nature wants to understand how it will all work out. But such knowledge is not a requirement of obedience. God wants us to believe, trust him, and do what he instructs. If we will trust Him enough to take the first step, we can be sure that God will lead us on. Noah kept on building while those around him thought he was crazy. We, also, find ourselves counter to society when we are doing the will of the Lord God Almighty. Noah trusted God, obeyed and followed God's instructions on what and how to build what saved him and the animals from dying. Trust is also essential in our lives as we walk with the Lord. Without it we would be like a car without wheels going nowhere. Noah shows us how to live for God. Listen to the Lord, trust Him, and then obey. It can be scary when we do not understand, however, anytime we follow the Lord's instructions we win simply because we have obeyed Him. What obstacles cause you to waver in your trust in God? What personal assurances do you find about God's ways in Isaiah 55:11? What benefits of trust Him are mentioned in Psalm 34:8-10?

If you are courageous enough to take it, your life will be great.
